## The Princes and the Pea

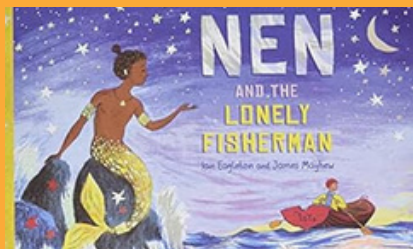
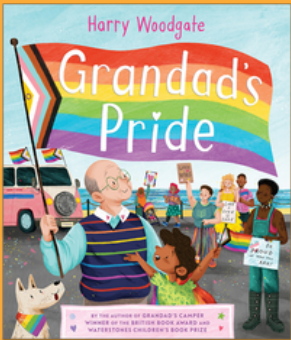
Peter Bently and Claire Powell

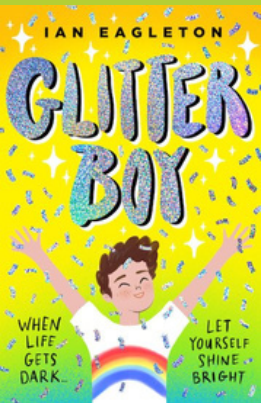
## Nen and the Lonely Fisherman

## Glitter Boy

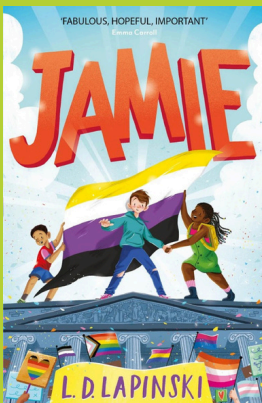
Ian Eagleton

## Homebody\*

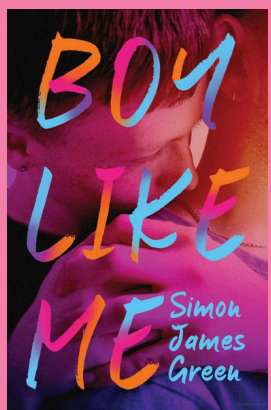
Theo Parish

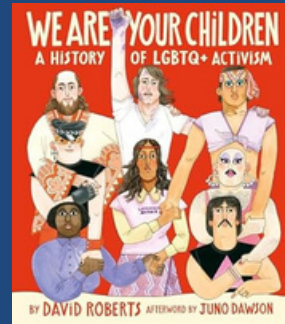


## The Black Flamingo
